Sequence	
Objective(s) / Learning	Activities will help students:
Target(s):	 understand that food insecurity impacts people locally
	as HS students, they can make a difference by donating food locally
Materials Needed:	LCD Projector
Suggested Process:	1. Before you start the activity, ask your students to share any pieces of good news they have (something good that's happened to them since your last meeting – from school, personal lives, extracurriculars, etc.). Not everyone has to share, but give kids a chance to do this. You can model this by sharing a piece of good news that you have.
	2. Ask students if they know what MICA is or stands for? It is the Mid Iowa Community Action organization that serves needy families. One of the most visible services MICA provides is the local food pantry.
	Every fall, MICA struggles to keep its food pantry shelves stocked to meet the needs of local families. In the fall of 2019, we collected almost 2,000 pounds of food and more than \$2,500 & we're going to try to beat that this year.
	 3. How important is MICA to some families? * When families don't have enough food – "food insecure" – they have to make choices like these: - 69% of food insecure families must choose between buying food or paying for their utilities (gas, electricity, water, etc.) - 67% of food insecure families must choose between buying food or putting gas in their vehicles - 66% of food insecure families must choose between buying food or getting medical care - 58% of food insecure families must choose between buying food or paying for housing
	 4. Here's an example of a why food pantries are important Most people at this Dayton Food Pantry Work / Left Behind America (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4ueWOBv6DH8) After watching the video, use these discussion prompts with your group: What kind of people turn to this food bank for help? How is the food bank important to the families that go there? Why does the director of outreach say she doesn't like to see kids at the food bank? What impacts is food insecurity having on these kids? How can we help fight food insecurity? Some people say that "people in poverty have no one to blame but themselves." Do you agree or disagree with that statement – why?
